2018 Women Caring for the Land Highlights

Monarch Chrysalis

At the Sargent county event, one woman shared the Milkweed she collected from her garden with a soon-to-be emerged Monarch. The Monarch Butterfly will only lay it's eggs on Milkweed species so if you want to do your part, don't spray or mow your Milkweeds!



DIY Infiltration Test

Dessa Sand performs a quick soil infiltration test on ex-crop land converted to pasture by pounding in a soil ring and timing how long it takes water to infiltrate – an easy way to compare fields and track improvements!

Conservation Note of the Quarter:

Got Saline? Grow Green!

Due to North Dakota's geology, many of our soils hold salts. However land management practices that increase evaporation, draw these salts through the soil profile to the surface. The key to improving salinity issues, is managing water evaporation. Keeping areas of concern "green" for longer allows water to move through a plant and transpire without raising salts to the surface. Cover crops and perennial plantings are an excellent way to reduce inputs on those acres while lowering salt levels.



Pheasants Forever offers a number of cost share programs through our Precision Ag and Conservation Specialists for producers looking to do just that!
