THE FLYER READS: "Calling all huntresses and conservation-minded women! Please join us in kickstarting North Dakota's first women-only PF chapter..."



The purpose of the Women, Wine and Wild Game event was to serve as a kickstart event for a new women's PF chapter in the Bismarck area, the state's capitol.

"Our all-women's team believes in passing on our passion for hunting and the outdoors to other women," Bush said. "So, we decided to host a series of events in 2018 focusing on that."

The team has a Women's Wingshooting Clinic scheduled for June 7 at Capitol City Sporting Clays near Bismarck that will provide an introduction to shotguns and wingshooting. Then they plan to follow that up

with another wingshooting clinic later in summer and top off the year's events with a women's dove or pheasant hunt.

Bush and her team hope that by outlining the specific goals of the women's chapter and recruiting committee members with similar interest and goals, the chapter can take over sponsorship and planning of women-centered or family learning events in the future.
